For immediate release (Boston, MA) – The Boston Camerata's pioneering programs of early American music have brought pleasure to thousands of music lovers, and helped to clarify and define our country's rich and diverse cultural identity. Having recently returned from an international tour, it's only fitting to reconnect with our roots in our aptly program, *Trav'ling Home: American Spirituals, 1770–1870*, tracing the migratory currents and flows of such repertoire, largely spiritual but also secular.

Above all, this repertoire consists of music for voice, and pieces can often be linked to oral traditions originating in the British Isles. In this program, we encounter the Puritans of New England, the Shakers, the Amish and Mennonites of Pennsylvania, and the newly-freed African-American religious communities.

These songs – celebrating love, peace, angst, yearning, and community – represent what is best and, hopefully, most permanent in the American soul. As the United States currently traverses a period of turmoil and crisis, may this music help us maintain and keep uppermost what is good and beautiful in the American dream.
